

UNION UCC: RELEVANT, ENGAGED, and GROWING

Our Steering Without Oars group has been meeting since May 2022. They were the first to step into our boat! In October 2022 we invited 40 more leaders in our church to join us and formed the Leadership Planning Team. We have been meeting almost monthly looking at and creating a vision for God's ministry and mission at Union. In June 2023 we presented all of our work to Consistory who agreed to partner with us in our next steps.

Our Leadership Planning Team and Consistory met in January and received updates from our Marketing Team, the Open and Affirming (ONA) process, and Pastor Carrie's input on wellness and mental health initiatives.

Rev. Bonnie Bates, Penn Northeast Conference Minister joined us to help integrate the work we have done and create a plan for for what's next.

Each LPT team member has been asked to serve on 1 of 3 teams: Architect interviews and design process with LPT and congregation, Capital Campaign and Financial piece of next steps, and Purpose and Why of Renovating Memorial Hall.

Our next day long retreat is on Saturday, March 16th.

The Allentown Warming Station at the YMCA

The Warming Station provides shelter, food, and a safe place for those experiencing homelessness in the community. They are open to welcome guests Nov 1 - April 15. The guests are greeted with kindness and provide a safe place to sleep and a dignified sense of community for neighbors in need. The doors are open each night from 7 pm - 7 am. The YMCA also provides healthy dinner time meals seven days a week.

Parkland C.A.R.E.S. Food Pantry

Parkland C.A.R.E.S. strives to feed and serve every member of the community affected by and suffering from hunger. Established in 2019 in the Kernsville area of Parkland School District, the pantry initially served 12 families. Fast forward to today, the food pantry serves over 130 families who are provided with a variety of food items each month. Parkland C.A.R.E.S. is proud to serve families in the Parkland community.

From the Maui Food Bank

Aloha Friends at Union UCC in Neffs,

This holiday season, I am filled with gratitude for the unwavering support that our community has demonstrated in the face of adversity.

Before the Lahaina fires, one in 10 people in Maui County were food insecure, and an alarming one in four children were at risk of going hungry. In the months following the fires in August, the Maui Food Bank and our partner agencies have become beacons of hope for those in need. We served 27,163 people in August, 30,577 people in September, and over 40,000 individuals in October.

Over 4 million pounds of food has been distributed since the fires, including 600,000 pounds of fresh produce. For comparison, we typically distribute 3.25 million pounds of food during the whole year.

Thank you for being a part of this incredible journey, and for letting us continue to build a community where the spirit of giving and caring for one another prevails.



From John Harting and the Financial Leadership Team

I know I don't have to tell you that the cost of running a household has increased over the last couple of years, as has the cost of running this church.

How has our congregation been doing in this environment of increasing prices? During the first six months of our current fiscal year (from July through the end of last year) income from offering envelopes is \$15,600 below our budget for the same six-month period. At a time when building maintenance expenses, salaries, program expenses and the needs of the benevolent organizations outside of this church that we support are expanding, our members' contributions to all that is our program are not keeping up with what it takes to fully fund our mission.

We need to remember that our church changes lives. It changes those lives because of you. And it changes lives beyond these four walls. Consider that last year we provided donations of over \$68,000 to about 30 organizations or programs in our community and beyond. The entire list was in our annual report.

Because of you our church also changes lives right here amongst our own people – members and friends of Union UCC. Our dedicated and competent staff fulfill their ministry to us, largely because your dollars provide for their salaries and the resource tools they need to do their jobs. Without your gifts we would not be able to engage in the programs, projects, ministry, and worship experiences that define our community life.

When is the last time you increased your giving here? You might find it enlightening to look at your annual or monthly income to calculate what percentage of your income finds its way to Union UCC. If our members increased their financial commitment by just 1% - that would be transformative to our budget and ministries. Might that be a challenge you would be willing to accept? If you are an e-giver giving a set amount on a repetitive schedule, might you consider getting back into the portal to tick up your giving amount if you haven't done so recently?

Our Financial Leadership Team meets monthly, and when we do I come away inspired by the diligence with which we collaborate to make sure that the budget we prepare maximizes the impact of the gifts this church receives. You rightly expect your contributions be used wisely for **God's work, and we feel the weight of that burden.** Our task to determine spending priorities is harder when our congregation falls short of budget targets. And so, as we begin a new year, our Team asks you to prayerfully consider the financial commitment you will make in 2024 to this wonderful place we call our spiritual home.





"Are You Mad At Me?" by Tyler and Cody Feder and "Lawrence and Sophia" by Doreen and Brian Cronin.

Both of these books sparked heartfelt discussion among the adults, particularly how we can assist children in expressing their emotions and how the world is so much different than "when we were kids."

"Lawrence and Sophia" introduced feelings of anxiety about trying something new or going into unfamiliar territory alone. The world can be scary for us all, not just children!

Opening up our lives to new experiences, especially with a friend, can help us feel less isolated, lonely, or stagnant. A new goal or dream or new experience can help us feel alive and energized.

There are lots of great literature resources for children and teens emerging right now. If you have children in your life, I encourage you to look them up!

I visited those who are hospitalized, ill, or experiencing grief or life challenges; participated in funerals and baptisms; created and led GriefShare; and organized and led Helping Hearts, Helping Meals, and Golden Times groups as well as our Breathe and Prayers with a Pastor services, just to name a few.
